14A★ Page 17, line 7, at end insert –

- “(6) Nothing in this Act prevents a consumer from exercising any rights arising under the Consumer Rights Act 2015, the Consumer Contracts (Information, Cancellation and Additional Charges) Regulations 2013 (S.I. 2013/3134), the Consumer Protection from Unfair Trading Regulations 2008 (S.I. 2008/1277) or any other enactment or rule of law that is intended for the protection of, or provision of redress for, consumers.
- (7) A compliance failure within the meaning of this Act is actionable by a consumer in accordance with the statutory rights and remedies available under the Consumer Rights Act 2015, or as a breach of duty under any other applicable enactment or rule of law.”

Member’s explanatory statement

This amendment would ensure that the provisions of this Bill will not conflict with any existing legal rights regarding the enforcement of consumer law, ensuring that redress for defective connectable products can be sought by individual consumers as opposed to solely leaving the redress procedure to the designated enforcement body to ensure compliance.
