

Hunting Trophies (Import Prohibition) Bill

TO BE MOVED

IN COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE HOUSE

Clause 1

LORD ROBATHAN

Clause 1, page 1, line 3, leave out “an animal” and insert “a species classed as threatened on the International Union for the Conservation of Nature’s Red List, and where that list records trophy hunting as a threat to that species,”

THE EARL OF LEICESTER

Clause 1, page 1, line 3, after “an” insert “wild”

THE EARL OF LEICESTER

Clause 1, page 1, line 4, leave out “by or on behalf of the hunter,”

VISCOUNT TRENCHARD

Clause 1, page 1, line 4, leave out “or on behalf of the hunter” and insert “the person who killed the animal,”

LORD ROBATHAN

Clause 1, page 1, line 5, after “hunter”, insert “with a declaration at the border being taken as sufficient verification,”

Clause 1, page 1, line 7, leave out “hunted” and insert “killed”

Clause 1, page 1, line 7, leave out “a place where the hunter resides”, and insert, “the address where the hunter is on the electoral register”

Clause 1, page 1, line 8, after “resides” insert “according to signed declarations at the border,”

Clause 1, page 1, line 9, leave out “hunted” and insert “killed”

“(1A) Nothing in this Act shall prohibit the bringing of a hunting trophy into Great Britain by or for a zoological collection.”

Clause 1, page 1, line 11, after “the” insert “dead”

Clause 1, page 1, line 11, leave out “an” and insert “a wild”

LORD HOWARD OF RISING

Clause 1, page 1, line 11, leave out from “animal” to the end of line 17

LORD SWIRE

Clause 1, page 1, line 11, after “animal” insert “killed in a hunt,”

LORD ROBATHAN

Clause 1, page 1, line 12, leave out “or derivative”

LORD HOWARD OF RISING

Clause 1, page 1, line 15, leave out “(which does not include consumption)”

LORD HOWARD OF RISING

Clause 1, page 1, leave out line 17

LORD HOWARD OF RISING

Clause 1, page 1, line 17, after “way” insert “with the exception of butterfly, spider, or insect-collecting if correct CITES permits have been obtained where necessary.”

LORD SWIRE

Clause 1, page 1, line 17, at end insert “unless the import is for scientific research, a museum, zoological collection or educational facility.”

Clause 2

VISCOUNT TRENCHARD

Clause 2, page 2, line 4, after “species” insert “normally hunted”

LORD HOWARD OF RISING

Clause 2, page 2, line 4, after “species”, insert “of mammal”

VISCOUNT TRENCHARD

Clause 2, page 2, line 5, at end insert “and where there is evidence they have been imported as trophies into the UK over the past fifty years”

LORD HOWARD OF RISING

Clause 2, page 2, line 5, at end insert “excluding species where there is no record of them being imported into the UK as trophies.”

LORD SWIRE

Clause 2, page 2, line 5, at end insert “excluding medicinal leeches”

LORD ROBATHAN

In Clause 2, page 2, after line 5, insert new subsection –

“(2) Nothing in this Act shall apply to animals killed on land recognised as promoting the conservation of endangered species by the International Union for the Conservation of Nature or the government of the country to which the land belongs.”

LORD BELLINGHAM

In Clause 2, page 2, after line 5, insert new subsection –

“(2) Nothing in this Act shall apply to animals killed as part of a management or cull programme undertaken within the laws of the government of the country in which the animal or animals were killed.”

Clause 3

LORD SWIRE

Lord Swire gives notice of his intention to oppose the Question that Clause 3 stand part of the Bill.

Clause 4

VISCOUNT TRENCHARD

Clause 4, page 2, line 35, leave out from “trophies” to the end of line 36 and insert “from species of animals classed as vulnerable, endangered, or critically endangered according to the International Union of Conservation and Nature’s Red List.”

LORD BELLINGHAM

Clause 4, page 2, line 38, leave out “import of hunting trophies” and insert “environmental impact of importing hunting trophies.”

LORD BELLINGHAM

Clause 4, page 2, line 39, at end insert –

“(5) The Advisory Board shall, in consultation with the International Union for the Conservation of Nature and with the governments of those states in which trophy hunting occurs, produce and maintain a register of land where hunting trophy proceeds fund the conservation of animal species.”

LORD SWIRE

Clause 4, page 2, line 39, at end insert –

“(5) Before this Act comes into effect the Advisory Board on Hunting Trophies shall produce a list of huntable species to which this Act applies”
