- 1. **CHRIS SALMON PERCIVAL:** Good afternoon. My name is Chris Salmon Percival, Clerk of Private Bills in the House of Lords and welcome to the Examination of the Holocaust Memorial Bill which I am conducting today. Robbie Owen, Parliamentary Agent at Pinsent Masons, the Parliamentary Agent for the Bill, is present.
