Commentary on Commons amendments Commons amendment to Clause 12: Typographical Correction

Commons amendment 1

6 This amendment would correct a typographical error in the Bill, removing clause 9 from the application of clause 12(4)(g).

Commons amendment to Clause 15: Financial Privilege

Commons amendment 2

7 This amendment would remove the privilege amendment inserted in the House of Lords, removing clause 15(2).

Commons New Clause: Regulations making provision within devolved competence

Commons amendment 3

8 This amendment would insert a new clause that would require the Secretary of State to obtain the consent of the relevant devolved government before making regulations that contain provision within devolved competence.
